## A HEALING MIRACLE FOR BURNS

*This was sent to us from a nurse:*

A young man sprinkling his lawn and bushes with pesticides wanted to check the contents of the container to see how much pesticide remained in it. He raised the cover and lit his lighter; and, sadly, the vapors ignited and engulfed him. He began screaming.

His neighbor came out of her house with a dozen eggs and a bowl yelling, "Bring me some more eggs!" She broke them, separating their whites from the yolks. Another neighbor woman helped her to apply the whites onto the young man's face.

When the ambulance arrived and the EMTs saw the young man, they asked who had done this and all the neighbors pointed to the lady in charge.

The EMTs congratulated her and said, "You have saved his face."

By the end of the summer, the young man brought the lady a bouquet of roses to thank her. At that time, his face was like a baby's skin.

This treatment of burns is being included in teaching beginner fireman.

First aid treatment consists of *first* spraying cold water on the affected area until the heat is reduced which stops the continued burning of all layers of the skin.

Then, spread the egg whites onto the affected area.

One woman burned a large part of her hand with boiling water. In spite of the pain, she ran cold faucet water on her hand, separated two egg whites from the yolks, beat them slightly and dipped her hand in the solution. The whites then dried and formed a protective layer.

She later learned that the egg white is a natural collagen and continued during at least one hour to apply layer upon layer of beaten egg white. By afternoon she no longer felt any pain and the next day there was hardly a trace of the burn. Ten days later, no trace was left at all and her skin had regained its normal color. The burned area was totally regenerated thanks to the collagen in the egg whites as a placenta full of vitamins. □

## MORE HELPFUL HINTS FOR EVERYONE—

1) Corn oil prevents hairballs in pets. Add a few drops of corn oil to your pets' food to prevent hairballs from forming. The thick oil helps the fur pass through the animal's system much quicker and easily.

2) Chalk keeps ants and slugs out of the house. Ants and slugs won't touch chalk...so, simply draw a line in front of your doorway where you are having problems with these pesky critters and they won't cross it, meaning they won't be able to get into your house.

3) Coke removes blood stains from clothing. Soak the stain in coke until the stain is dissolved, then wash the clothing as usual. Wash before the coke dries, though.

4) Mayonnaise removes bumper stickers. Spread mayonnaise on the bumper sticker and let sit for at least thirty minutes. Then, rub the sticker off with a towel, leaving a clean bumper!

5) Wax paper cleans can opener gears. Run a few small strips of wax paper through the can opener to clean out of the bits and pieces that have built up in the gears throughout the year. The wax will also rub off on the gears to protect for future use as well.

6) Cornstarch untangles knots. Sprinkle cornstarch into tough knots, such as shoe laces helps loosen them.

7) A banana peel polishes leather shoes. Use the inside of a banana peel to give shoes a professional and natural shine that will last for quite some time.

8) Olive oil works as shaving cream. The smoothness of the oil can replace the need for shaving cream, and it also provides great moisture. □
